### SECTION TWO: PATUHARAKEKE'S SUBMISSION(S):

4. Key Points: Why Patuharakeke oppose the Ngatiwai Trust Board Deed of Mandate Our key points:

### Introduction

- 1.1 This submission is made by Patuharakeke Te Iwi Trust Board (PTB) on behalf of Patuharakeke hapu.
- 1.2 PTB is the mandated body to represent the interests of Patuharakeke regarding the negotiation and settlement of historic Treaty of Waltangi grievances.
- 1.3 Patuharakeke has claims currently before the Waitangi Tribunal, namely Wai 504, Wai 745, and Wai 1308. All of these three claims have been included in the Ngatiwai Trust Board Deed of Mandate ("NTBDOM"). This submission represents the interests presented in Wai 745 and Wai 1308.
- Prior to the delineation of land blocks by the Native Land Court, the area of Patuharakeke interests included:

"...all the lands beginning at Otalka verging on Toetoe...then west to Tangihua, then south verging on the east to Ruarangi then Taipuha, then south east through Mareretu then Piroa to Mangawhai north of the harbour, then due east to include the islands of the Mokohinau group then towards Te Akau (the coast) to include the islands of Maul i roto and Maul i taha, Marotiri, Taranga, Ngatuturu (Sail Rock) thence to Manaia and Whangarei Heads; thence up the Whangarei Harbour to incorporate Patungarahi (Snake Bank) onward to Parua and Solomon's Pt then Tamaterau and Pakikaikutu, Rahongaua, Ruakekeno, Tahunatapu, and to include interests in the islands of Motupomona, Motukawau, Motu Karoro, Pouroa, Okoko, Tongamaru, Ko Mapuro at the Whangarei Heads area and in Whangarei Harbour across and up to Tikorangi (Portland) and Otaika and Toetoe.

"The southern side of the harbour includes Toetoe, Otalka, Tikorangi, Te Mahe, Karoronui, Titahi, Mahakitahi, Pikopikokaumatua, Totara, Kahuitieke, Hira Aute (Hirauta), Springfield, Mangapai, Mata, Kopuawaiwaha, Pokapu, Waiorehua, Waiparaoa, Te Kapaha, Mangawhati, Te Wita, Te Papa, Toituroa, Waitoheroa, Kuramakanoa, Ngatiti, Motupapa, Takahiwai, Okotuku, Waikauwera, Koutu and Te Arakahika, Te Rauiri, Matakaka, Poupouwhenua, Pitotorea, Patupo, Tupehau, Ruakaka, Orua, Uretiti, Waipu, Te Paritu, Te Waionepu, Pukewherowhero, Kaiweka, Ohiha, Te Hau o Manaia, Orua, Waipapa,

Wakapakeke, Mala, Opatea, Haukawarua, Hikuware, Wharekura, Pohuenui, Pukehinau, Poherangi, Pukekaramarama, Te Raka, Puketotara, Roto Moeho, Te Kaweka, Te Taotaonoa, Te Haronga, Taumatatuhi, Kaupare, Te Kapewhiti, Te Raorao, Te Uriowhetau, Wakatarariki, then onward to the northern side of Mangawhai again."

All the lands and waters, including swamps, lakes and ranges encompassed in this territory have traditionally been the domain of Patuharakeke or its ancient Aho Matua (parent grouping) with occasional seasonal rights such as patunga Kuaka, Parera, kopua Mango, Manu Oi shared in common with other related hapu.

In addition to the above Patuaharakeke acknowledge shared mana whenua and mana moana to Tawhiti Rahi and Aorangi (the Poor Knights Islands) through Oneho the grand-daughter of Motatau and their ancient Ngati Manaia whakapapa.

Other regions throughout the eastern seaboard from Te Rawhiti in the southern Bay of Islands to Motu Kokako (Piercy island) off Rakaumangamanga to Whangaruru, Mimiwhangata, Whananaki, Matapouri, Ngunguru, Tutukaka, Taiharuru, Pataua, Ohuatahi and Te Whara. From there to Aotea (Great Barrier), Hauturu (Little Barrier) and various areas of the coast right through to Mahurangi in the south hold significance for Patuharakeke, however it is acknowledged that they are attended to by whanaunga hapu who hold ahi ka roa in those rohe.

- 1.5 Patuharakeke have always acknowledged our whakapapa links to Ngatiwai through Manaia (1&2) and through the tupuna such as Te Taotahi and Te Ao Hei-Awa. However, Patuharakeke have not given any group, including Ngatiwai Trust Board ("NTB"), our mandate to settle our Treaty of Waitangi claims. We have also articulated this to all parties, including the Crown, and have stated that until we give this message directly, Patuharakeke holds its own mandate until further notice to all parties by Patuharakeke.
- 1.6 Patuharakeke have been managing our own environmental, legal and political matters ourselves but have sought to work collaboratively with others including NTB when this has been of mutual agreement and/or for specific purposes. This includes our attendance at various meetings we have attended to recognise our whanaungatanga-links. However, this does not and should not be fashioned to be tacitly giving our mandate to anyone.

### Our Submission

- 2 Patuharakeke oppose the NTBDOM for the following reasons:
- 2.1 NTB has not completed historical research on Treaty breaches for the area we refer to as te rohe o Patuharakeke. (We note that NTBDOM refers to this as the 'southern takiwa'). We also note that in our rohe there are three overlapping Iwi claimant groups who also claim our mandate (namely Te Runanga o Ngati Whatua, Tuhoronuku and NTB), to the exclusion of Te Runanga o Ngati Whatua, two are actively seeking to settle grievances inside our rohe without our permission. Te Runanga o Ngati Whatua have today confirmed their support to Patuharakeke and recognise our mana, autonomy and authority to settle our own treaty grievance settlements for Patuharakeke.
- 2.2 This is acknowledged on page 19 of the Ngatiwai Trust Boards Mandate Strategy ("NTBMS"):

"The remaining local areas yet to complete research are Pataua and Takahiwai. A summary of the claims to be put to the Crown has partially been completed based on generic research and those components of the local research completed for each of the three marae clusters."

- 2.3 Patuharakeke have completed our own comprehensive research which was presented before the Waitangi Tribunal in October 2013. Both Ngati Manuhiri and Ngati Rehua who were also part of the southern cluster referred to by NTB also completed their own research and have now progressed to separate negotiations/settlements with the Crown.
- 3 Ngatiwai have failed to achieve their mandate through a process that was "fair, open and transparent"
- 3.1 Patuharakeke were not notified when NTB initially began seeking the mandate in 2009 (letter from NTB to the Minister of Treaty of Waitangi Negotiations dated 30 November 2009), and were not given an opportunity at that stage to seek support for a separate settlement (as done by Ngati Manuhiri and Ngati Rehua). Patuharakeke have continuously maintained that we do not give our mandate to NTB to negotiate a settlement of its claims from the very beginning, yet NTB has failed to consider our views in the context of the mandate. To this end, since 2010, we had formally approached all lwi that we tatai to, to clarify if, what or how, this might be achieved. As a result of this process conducted by Patuharakeke, and the respective lwi responses, we have maintained our mandate.
- 3.2 Preliminary information sharing hui were held by NTB in early 2013. In terms of the purpose of these hui, page 26 of the NTBDOM states that "NTB held three preparatory information sharing hui to bring members up to date on a range of matters." Further, it is stated that "while debate and discussion was encouraged to help formulate ideas and build relationships the purpose of the hul was informative only."
- 3.3 These hui were followed up by two further hui with Patuharakeke specifically on 11 June 2013 and 23 July 2013. Given that these preliminary information sharing hui were focussed on being "informative" only, Patuharakeke were not given an opportunity to have their interests heard and considered by NTB. NTB states on page 28 of the NTBDOM that in all cases, "good progress was made with re-establishing positive working relationships in so far as discussions went."

- 3.4 However, at the meeting on 11 June 2013, Patuharakeke again maintained that we wanted our Wai claim numbers excluded from the NTB mandate (see notes from meeting attached). During this meeting NTB acknowledged that, "Patuharakeke may have other options which may or may not include Ngātiwai; however we still intend to be open & transparent with you regarding our processes." It was also stated by Haydn Edmonds\_Chairperson for Ngatiwai that NTB "are aware that there are some that want to come with us & some that don't, however the door will be left open." The purpose of the meeting was whakawhanaungatanga and information sharing. Deborah Harding from Patuharakeke clarified that, "Patuharakeke intend to continue the process through the Waitangi Tribunal until we get our sovereignty [recognised] and that we won't be doing anything until then." Merepeka Henley, Trustee for NTB affirmed to Patuharakeke that "it's not our role as the trust board to step over you." Despite this, the Wai claims of Patuharakeke remained included in the NTBDOM.
- 3.5 At the meeting held on 23 July 2013 at NTB's invitation, Patuharakeke attended out of courtesy and to confirm our position. In response to NTB's presentation of the basic, generic information sheet regarding mandating process, Patuharakeke advised that we were still proceeding to Waitangi Tribunal hearing in October 2013 and that there was no material information for our purposes that could fashion a response as to giving mandate.
- 3.6 As a result of the 'generic preliminary only' nature of these information sharing hui, Patuharakeke declined any further discussions and invitations to meet NTB on the basis that nothing material could be progressed that would recognise Patuharakeke's mana in our rohe and that the meetings themselves could be fashioned as indirectly providing mandate.
- 3.7 Further, following a meeting of Wai claimants held on 3 December 2013, a letter dated 4 December 2013 (see attached) was sent to the Office of Treaty Settlements on behalf of claimants for WAI 246, 1148, 1529, 1528, 1954, 620, 688, 745, 156, 1308, 245, 1512. This letter clearly stated that the claimants collectively oppose the NTBDOM and request the removal of those Wai numbers from the NTBDOM. The whanau hapu claimants illustrated NTB's lack of engagement using the handling of the Ngati Manuhiri settlement and the Hauturu issue as examples of this. An <u>urgent</u> meeting with Minister Chris Finlayson was requested to discuss the serious concerns of the whanau hapu claimants.
- The Disputes Resolution Process provided in the NTBDOM is not reliable and is an incomplete and therefore flawed process in our opinion
- 4.1 Page 35 of the NTBDOM acknowledges that following feedback from the various information sharing hui, "a number of Wai claimants (or submitters with an interest in particular Wai claims) do not want their Wai claims included in the NTB mandate."
- 4.2 Page 36 of the NTBDOM illustrates that one of NTB's response to this was to implement "a more formal dispute resolution process for claimants who have concerns about the way NTB is representing their interests in negotiations." As illustration this 'Amended Disputes Process' is outlined below.

### "53. Amended Disputes Procedure

In the event that any dispute, difference or question arises between the NTB and any claimant and provided the dispute is clearly set out in writing by the claimants, the Ngatiwai Trust Board agree to act in good faith and for the advancement of settlement. In particular:

Ngatiwai Trust Board agree to provide a <u>concise written reply</u> of any dispute at the earliest opportunity.



In August 2014 Kaumatua, Paratene Te Manu Wellington te toru (Aka Uncle Sonny Wellington) recalled that Morore Piripi (Mororekai Kaupeka Piripi, Paramount Chief of Ngatiwai b;1881-d;1965) attended a hui at Ngunguru in 1949. The purpose of his hui was to support Hau Kainga of Ngunguru in the establishment of the Ngunguru Marae.

Paratene Te Manu Wellington te toru (Aka Uncle Sonny Wellington) stated, "Morore Piripi from Whangaruru came to Ngunguru in 1949 and blessed the land the Marae stands on. I was 16 years old at the time and turned the first sod of earth to start the building of the Marae. Morore Piripi was a Ngatiwai Rangatira and Kaumatua from Whangaruru. Morore was the son of Henare Kaupeka Piripi, and the younger brother of Makere Piripi who was the matamua. Makere Piripi was married to Tame Haehae."

Paratene Te Manu Wellington te toru (Aka Uncle Sonny Wellington) further stated, "Hare Te Ngore (Charlie Maki) was on the original committee to help build the marae because at that time there was no Marae at Matapouri. This arrangement worked well until around the 1970's when Churlie then decided to build a marae at Matapouri. This also linked us to Ivy who was a Reti from Waikare and this was a strong bond to our Whangaruru kin."

Paratene Te Manu Wellington te toru (Aka Uncle Sonny Wellington) added, "The timber for the Marae was sourced from the Kauri forests in Ngaiotonga and was trucked to Ngunguru by Sonny Reti. This was in recognition of our common Ngatiwai whakapapa and Rihipaea, the first child of Mata Te Kura. Rihipaea's father was Haki Pere or Jack Bell a Pakeha. Rihipaea was secretly sent to Whangaruru as a child. There are clearly Ngatiwai interests in the Ngunguru rohe and in the rohe from Moto Kokako right down to Omaha."

Paratene Te Manu Wellington te toru (Aka Uncle Sonny Wellington) concluded, "When I was young the relationships between Ngati Korora, Ngati Takapari and Te Waiariki was respected. We were governed by the Shark, the kaitiaki of the moana, and they believed in those things. A lot of how we determined who was where was based on our mana moana. Given that we were a small tribe at certain times this made us strong. There were boundaries of common use. For us it went up to the devils staircase just a bit north of Waiparoe. Also Motutara and Goat Is (Motokumi). Horahora comes out the creak and into Taihauruu. I tautoko what the Ngatiwai Trust Board are doing for our iwi. Kia rangimarie, te haerenga taki hia "

In 1965 a gazette notice was issued setting aside land for the purposes of a Marae for the common use and benefit of the 'Waiariki sub-tribe of Ngatiwai.' (Document Attached)

The Marae charter (adopted at AGM on 25 September 2005) acknowledges that the members of the Ngunguru Marae include 'Ngatiwai, Ngati Takapari, Ngati Korora, Waiariki of the Ngunguru District' and are deemed to be members and beneficiaries of the Ngunguru Marae. The key point here is that this is another place that Ngatiwai is acknowledged as belonging to this rohe. (Document Attached)

The combination of these two documents also confirm that Ngatiwai have a long standing established and acknowledged presence in this area.

We also acknowledge our whanaunga of Te Waiariki. We tautoko their right to choose the path they wish to follow in order to settle with the Crown. We all still bury our deceased here, our ahi-ka still burns on our lands and as representatives of our marae we acknowledge our aroha for our whanaunga of Te Waiariki and Ngatiwai through our common bonds through Ngati Takapari.

Ngunguru is very clearly within the Ngatiwai Rohe.

Our Marae is named Ngunguru Marae. The Wharenui of Ngunguru Marae is named after our Ngatiwai tupuna Paratene Te Manu, a contemporary of Te Moananui. Paratene Te Manu died in 1896 and before his death he claimed he was 100 years of age.

Paratene Te Manu is our tupuna and he identified himself as being of Ngatiwai descent, going back to Hikihiki, Tau Kokopu and Kau Te Awha. The pa site of Tau Kokopu is in the headlands in front of Philip Island, between Church Bay and Kowharewa Bay. The site of where Kau Te Awha stayed is in Church Bay. These places are all situated on the Ngunguru/Tutukaka coast.

Paratene Te Manu, in his own lifetime, was a recognised Rangatira of Ngatiwai. Paratene Te Manu is a recognised Rangatira of Ngatiwai today. Because of his mana and status within Ngatiwai he had inherited land throughout the rohe of Ngatiwai including on Hauturu, Tutukaka, Ngunguru and Whangaruru. Among this land Paratene Te Manu inherited was the land that Ngunguru Marae is now standing on, Tuateanui (2B1A).

Ngati Takapari is, in some ways, unique in that it is a hapu with claims and connections to Te Waiariki and Ngatiwai. It is through our Ngati Takapari whakapapa we exercise our Ngatiwai mana moana and Ngatiwai mana whenua. It has been a longstanding view by the people of Ngunguru and Tutukaka, in both tuturu Maori times and contemporary times that we share common tupuna and strong whakapapa links between Te Waiariki and Ngatiwai.

As the kaitiaki of Ngunguru Marae and the current Ngunguru Marae Trustees Committee we have acknowledged our Ngatiwai whakapapa and are rightfully represented on the Ngatiwai Trust Board. We stand by our right and the rights of those beneficiaries of Ngunguru Marae, registered with the Ngatiwai Trust Board, who have chosen to support the Ngatiwai Trust Board in its seeking a mandate.

Through our Ngatiwai whakapapa we exercise our Ngatiwai mana whenua, Ngatiwai mana moana and the right to allow the Ngatiwai Trust Board, on our behalf, to seek settlement with the crown on Ngatiwai issues and grievances in areas of Ngatiwai interests.

I am the chairperson of the Ngunguru Marae Trustees Committee. At a hui of the Ngunguru Marae Trustees in August 2014 I was tasked to write this submission. It is therefore on my and their behalf, and with the consultation and consent of Ngunguru Marae Trustees I am forwarding this submission. This submission also contains the input and endorsement of our Kaumatua, Paratene Te Manu Wellington te toru (Aka Uncle Sonny Wellington) and Kuia Erica Wellington.

The Late Kaumatua, Eric Wellington, also spoke to many of us of the korero contained in this submission and corroborated this view. Before his death Eric Wellington wrote a letter, dated 1 July 2013, to the Chairman of the Ngatiwai Trust Board to inform the Chair we had decided to give the Ngatiwai Trust Board our mandate. I have also attached a letter written by the Ngunguru Marae Trustees Committee, dated 13 August 2013, addressed to your office submitting that Ngunguru Marae be removed forthwith from the Ngapuhi/Tuhoronuku mandate. (Document Attached)



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#### Mission Statement

The tikenge of the hapu takes precedence over the Charter. A kaunihera of kuiz and kaumatus will advise the trustees on matters of tikenge.

- 1. Effective date This charter is effective from 12 September 2004. This Charter was amended at the AGM held 25 September 2005
- 2. Name The organisation will be known as Ngunguru Marae. The committee will be known as Ngunguru Marae Trustees Committee. The facilities will be known collectively as Ngunguru Marae, incorporating the wharenui, known as Paratene te Manu, the wharekai, known as Manaakitia te Iwi, and all additional buildings and facilities upon the marae reservation and the Ngunguru Wahi Tapu reserve.
- 3. Purpose The committee is to operate, maintain and administer the facilities, chattels, and environs of the Ngunguru Marae Reservation situated at 60 Waiotoi Road, Ngunguru, Block Tuateanui 2b1a, for and on behalf of the members and beneficiaries of the Ngunguru Marae. The provisions of Te Ture Whenua Act 1993, as described in the booklet Maori Reservations 2002 (referred to as MR herein), are the over-arching guidelines for the operation of the Marae. The trust is to operate, maintain and administer the facilities, chattels and environs of the Ngunguru Wahi Tapu Reserve situated at 1 Matapouri Road, Ngunguru, for and on behalf of the descendants of the families who are members of the Wahi Tapu Reserve.
- 4. Jurisdiction of the Trustees committee (see MR page 10)

The Trustees committee shall have full jurisdiction over and overseeing of:

- 4.1 Decisions involving maintenance, repairs or alterations to the buildings.
- 4.2 Maintaining in good repair all property and when necessary replacing any such property that may be beyond repair.
- 4.3 Hiring the facilities and collecting rental from such hireage.
- 4.4 Payment of all accounts and charges required for the upkeep or continued operation of the facilities.
- 4.5 Recovery of any rental or monies outstanding, including legal action for recovery of same.
- 4.6 All activities undertaken by its members in the name of the marae, including representation on other statutory and representative bodies, and any fundraising activities.
- 4.7 Notwithstanding all such jurisdiction bestowed, the Trustees committee shall ever bear in mind that all actions and purposes are to be performed for and on behalf of the beneficiaries of the Ngunguru Marze
- 4.8 The trustees shall proactively provide policies and promote activities such as wananga, hui and other activities that provide for capacity building of its members in te reo Maori, tikanga Maori, nga toi, te matauranga and hau ora.

#### 5. The Trustees Committee

- 5.1 The committee shall consist of up to nine (9) trustees who are appointed by the Maori Land Court, and remain in office until removed by the Court. (see MR page 9) Trustees will be elected at an annual general meeting and are required to stand down after a period of 3 years.
- 5.2 The committee shall elect a Chairman and a Secretary and Treasurer from among their midst.
- 5.3 The committee shall have power to co-opt other persons qualified as in clause 8 below (membership) to assist in carrying out such projects as the committee deems necessary, the co-option to cease on completion of such business. The legal responsibilities and liabilities included in the powers of the trustees may not be delegated. (see MR p 10)
- 5.4 Any trustee missing three (3) consecutive trustees committee meetings without good and proper reason shall forfeit their position and a new trustee will be selected as in clause 9.3 below.

5.5 A trustee may be removed by the Maori Land Court if it deems it necessary after hearing relevant evidence. Applications for removal of a trustee may be made to the Court by the trustees or by decision of a majority of the beneficiaries at a general meeting called for the purpose.

5.6 Any beneficiary shall be eligible to be elected as a trustee subject to the conditions of Te Ture Whenua

Act (see MR p 9).

5.7 Retiring trustees may be re-elected.

5.8 Transitional arrangements

To allow for continuity of trustee membership, the retirement of trustees from 2004 shall be by rotation. In 2004, 3 of the trustees elected in 2002 shall retire, and an election held for the 3 vacancies. In 2005, of the remaining 6 trustees elected in 2002, 3 will retire by ballot, and 3 will have a further term of 1 year. In 2006, the remaining 3 trustees who were elected in 2002 shall retire. From 2007 onwards, each trustee shall retire as his or her term of three years is completed. In 2007 clause 5.8 of this charter shall be removed.

6 Ouorum

A quorum of five (5) trustees (not less than 51% of trustees) including the Chairman and Secretary shall be present before any general meeting of the committee can proceed, notwithstanding provision made for sickness when a Chairman or Secretary can be elected pro tempore (for the time needed). (see MR p 10)

7 Executive Committee

In event of urgency, decisions regarding payment of accounts or matters requiring urgent maintenance or security may be made by an executive committee consisting of Chairman, Secretary and one other elected trustee, but any matters so decided must be brought to the attention of the full committee for ratification at the next meeting.

8 Membership

All members of Ngati Wai, Ngati Taka, Ngati Korora, Waiariki of the Ngunguru District are deemed to be members and beneficiaries of the Ngunguru Marae. (This eligibility is as notified in the Gazette notice of 1963.) (see MR page 3)

#### 9 Election Procedure

- 9.1 Written nominations for trusteeship signed by mover, seconder and candidate shall be in the hands of the Committee secretary not less than seven days prior to the Annual General Meeting in September.
- 9.2 Nominations may be made from the floor of the Annual meeting after the list of candidates has been read, any candidate so nominated must be in attendance and must be a beneficiary of the Marae.
- 9.3 Nominated persons are to speak to the membership at the meeting as to what they are able to contribute to the role, prior to the election.
- 9.4 In case of insufficient nominations those nominated shall be deemed elected and a request made to the whanau for further nominations at a Special General Meeting.
- 9.5 When an election is necessary this will be by show of hands, or if requested by a majority, by written ballot.
- 9.6 In the case of a casual vacancy more than 6 months before an Annual General Meeting, a new trustee is to be elected at a Special General Meeting to serve to the end of the term of the trustee who has gone.
- 9.7 Decision to allow proxy voting is to be made at the meeting by those present. If proxies allowed, members unable to attend a meeting may allocate their vote by written proxy to a member in attendance.

#### 10 Meetings

The Trustees committee shall meet when required, and not less than six times per year at the Marae, to:

- 10.1 determine a schedule of maintenance and repair
- 10.2 consider the statement of cash accounts and approve payment of all accounts due
- 10.3 consider all requests from the membership
- 10.4 consider projects, wananga, hui, and resource consent submissions
- 10.5 promote and provide for activities which are in keeping with tikanga of the hapu.
- 10.6 Meetings are to be open to all beneficiaries, speaking rights are at the discretion of the meeting.
- 10.7 Only trustees may vote.

11 Annual general meeting (see MR page 14)

- 11.1 This shall be held during the month of September each year to report on and account for the actions of the trustees over the preceding year to the members, and to
  - adopt the Chairman's report
  - · receive the balance sheet and statement of accounts
  - elect 3 trustees, new or retiring, to those 3 positions that have become vacant by rotation, resignation, removal or death.
  - elect representatives to iwi and hapu authorities
  - deal with other agenda items previously notified in time for the advertisements and notices (4 weeks in advance)
- 11.2 Notice of time and place and agenda of the annual meeting shall be placed in community newspapers 21 days before (MR p 14).
- 11.3 The Annual general meeting will be chaired by a trustee or a person nominated by the trustees. (MR p 14)

12 Monies (see MR page 15)

- 12.1 All monies received shall be duly receipted, recorded, and banked in the committee's approved bank account.
- 12.2 All payments made will be by cheque signatories being the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer and one other trustee any two to sign.
- 12.3 Once in each year the Treasurer shall provide a Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet, duly audited, for presentation to the Annual general meeting.
- 12.4 All monies received shall be used solely for the purposes outlined in clause 3 above.
- 12.5 Any profit above that required for operating expenses may be placed on secured term deposit to defray future maintenance.
- 12.6 In event of there being insufficient funds for operating expenses, the Marae will be deemed inoperable; a meeting of beneficiaries must be held to advise of this circumstance.

13 Liability

- 13.1 The responsibility for debts and other liabilities shall be borne by the trust,
- 13.2 Individual trustee/s shall not be held accountable or liable for any debts and/or liabilities nor any losses, provided they are not attributable to that Trustees own dishonesty or to wilful commission or omission by that Trustee of any act known by that trustee to be a breach of trust.
- 13.3 Each trustee shall be entitled to full and complete indemnity from the Trust funds for any personal liability incurred or arising from acting for or on behalf of the Marae as a trustee, provided such liability does not stem from dishonesty, or acts of commission or omission known to be in breach of trust.

14 Amendments to the Charter

- 14.1 Amendments must be notified in the agenda items for the Annual General Meeting or Special Meeting of beneficiaries.
- 14.2 may be made by majority vote at an Annual General Meeting

15 Resolution of Conflicts

15.1 Conflicts between trustees and beneficiaries are to be resolved by seeking mediation from kuia and kaumatua and according to tikanga. The matter may be referred to the Maori Land Court (see MR p 18) for a ruling if no agreement can be reached and the matter is within the jurisdiction of te Ture Whenua Act 1993.

16 Committees associated with the Marae (see MR page 11)

16.1 The trustees shall approve written guidelines, submitted by all sub-committees.

- 16.2 The trustees may from time to time establish sub-committees as it deems necessary for the effective operation of the marae.
- 16.3 The Marae committee shall be appointed by the trustees to carry out the operations of the Marae during hui and other authorised events.
- 16.4 The property committee shall be appointed by the trustees to oversee and organise the maintenance, repairs and general upkeep and upgrades of the Marke facilities and equipment.
- 16.5 The fundraising committee shall be appointed by the trustees to carry out sundry activities to ensure there are sufficient funds available for operations, maintenance, and fixed expenses of the marae.
- 16.6 All committees are to have the power to co-opt additional members.
- 16.7 A Maori committee when constituted, is to be supported by the marae, but is not a part of the Marae sub-committees. (MR p 11)
- 16.8 A Wahi Tapu committee consisting of 6 members, at least 3 of whom must be trustees, is to be formed for the purpose of operating and maintaining the Wahi Tapu.

#### 17 Operations of committees associated with the Marae

- 17.1 The powers of the trustees are not able to be delegated to the committees (see MR page 10).
- 17.2 The provisions of this constitution shall be binding upon all the Marae's committees.
- 17.3 The trustees' minutes, bank accounts and financial records shall keep accurate records of the activities of all its committees.
- 17.4 Each committee shall provide a report of its activities to the trustees at their regular meetings.
- 17.5 Committees may be disestablished at any time at a meeting of the trustees.
- 17.6 The Wahi Tapu sub-committee shall operate its own bank account and appoint its own signatories for that bank account. The Wahi Tapu sub-committee shall report regularly on its financial affairs to the Trustees.
